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### **Bromham Road Resurfacing Works**

Bromham Road is being currently being resurfaced over the course of 6 weeks, work started on 1st of October and is expected to finish on 9th of November.

The resurfacing works will cover Bromham Road from Dame Alice Street to just past Dynevor Road. There will also be some drainage repair and kerbing replacement carried out during the course of these works, as well as preparatory works for future traffic signal upgrades at the Union Street and Greyfriars junctions.

As many local residents and businesses know, Bromham Road is a major traffic route for Bedford. As such, the Council has planned these vital resurfacing and repair works to minimise disruption to road users, and people in the area.

The works will be carried out overnight from 8pm-6am, with the road re-opened during the day to minimise traffic disruptions. The works will also be carried out in three phases which will limit the amount of Bromham Road that will be closed at any one time and allow for suitable traffic diversions.

Phase One runs from Shakespeare Road to Conduit Road, Phase Two from Conduit Road to just past Greyfriars and Phase Three from that junction to Dame Alice Street.



Cllr Charles Royden, Portfolio Holder for Environment and Transport said "We apologise for any inconvenience this road closure will cause; these are crucial works for this major road in and out of Bedford. Local residents and businesses will receive letters alerting them to the works, and on-site notice boards and signage placed on major junctions in the town will give advance notice of this closure."

### Sports personalities get behind campaign to tackle child sexual exploitation of boys



Boys and young men can be the victims of child sexual exploitation (CSE), and this is the message that local sports personalities and role models in Bedfordshire are helping to push out over the next few weeks, as part of a new social media awareness campaign.

Bedfordshire Police, in partnership with Bedford Borough Council, Luton Council, Central Bedfordshire Council and Bedfordshire Clinical Commissioning Group, are joining forces to tackle CSE in the new #ItHappensToBoysToo campaign which launches today (Monday).

CSE is a type of child abuse in which children are sexually exploited for money, power or status. It sees children and young people under 18 involved in exploitative situations, contexts or inappropriate relationships where the young person receives 'something', such as accommodation, drugs, alcohol, gifts or even affection, as a result of them performing, or being involved in, sexual activities.

The aim of the #ItHappensToBoysToo campaign is to continue to raise awareness of CSE, but to highlight that boys and young men can also find themselves as victims of this type of abuse. It also aims to increase the number of cases that are reported, as it is thought that boys often find it more difficult than girls to disclose what is happening to them.

The social media campaign sees Bedfordshire Police engaging with role models, such as police officers, fire fighters and paramedics, as well as local sports personalities, including Olympians Kriss Akabusi and Etienne Stott, who are getting behind the campaign and helping to raise awareness. Detective Superintendent Nick Bellingham said: "Children at risk of CSE are not exclusive to one gender; it happens to boys too. Any child can be exploited. Protecting vulnerable children is everyone's business, and we all need to be alert, to know what to look out for and where to go for advice, as well as having the confidence to report any acts of abuse safe in the knowledge that they will be acted on.

"Partnership working is key to fighting this important issue so I'm pleased that Bedfordshire is uniting in this campaign to help put an end to the suffering of these children who are being exploited."

Cllr Shan Hunt Portfolio Holder for Children's Social Care at Bedford Borough Council, said: "We know that male victims are reluctant to discuss difficult issues and therefore less likely to report their abuse. It's important we recognise the signs of CSE and ensure that male victims are not overlooked."

Luton Council's Director of People Amanda Lewis, said: "Across Bedfordshire we are committed to working together in tackling CSE and safeguarding children. We want to raise awareness and provide children with the confidence to be able to report their concerns, knowing that they will be acted upon."

Sue Harrison, Central Bedfordshire Council's Director of Children's Services, said: "We understand the difficulty in speaking out about CSE, especially for boys and young men and with the #ItHappensToBoysToo campaign, we want to reach out to anyone who may be a victim to let them know there is support available."

### Partnership working results in property closure

The community police team in Bedford has secured a threemonth closure of a property in Rutland Road, after it was reported as a source of anti-social behaviour and drug criminality.

The officers, who worked closely with Bedford Borough Council, attended Luton Magistrates' Court hearing today (Friday) and were granted a full three month closure order.

PC Sharon Cummings, from the Bedford community team, said: "We are dedicated to tackling antisocial behaviour in Bedford. Thanks to support from the Bedford Borough Council's community safety team we've managed to secure a closure order.

"We are continuing to encourage our residents to come forward with information about drug crime and anti-social behaviour in their area, as each report helps us build a better intelligence picture of this kind of crime in Bedford."

Cllr Colleen Atkins, Portfolio Holder for Community Safety and Regulatory Services said "The actions associated with this house have no place in Bedford Borough. This closure is a clear example of the strengths of our partnership working with the Police and local residents. We hope it sends out a clear message that crime and disorder will not be tolerated here."

### Nine weapons have been taken off the streets after a weapons sweep in Bedford

A meat cleaver, several knives and a baton were among the items recovered by community officers during the operation on Wednesday.

The work was undertaken as part of a joint week of action by the Bedford Borough Community Safety Partnership in the Midland Road and Tavistock Street areas.

Bedford Borough Council, Bedfordshire Police and Bedfordshire Fire and Rescue Service will be working in partnership with the local community to concentrate on ways to help improve the two areas, including activities and events that local residents and businesses can be involved in.

PC Emily Keech, from the Bedford community policing team, said: "Taking all these weapons off the street is a positive result from the team and will help keep the public safe.

"Our work to tackle knife crime is ongoing, and we continue to work with partners, schools and retailers. It's unacceptable to carry a knife and our message to people is simply: don't do it. "This week of action is looking at various different ways we can improve this part of Bedford and the police are proud to play our part alongside partners and the community."

Cllr Colleen Atkins, Portfolio Holder for Community Safety at Bedford Borough Council said "Taking these dangerous weapons off the streets is just one of the excellent results from the Week of Action. 'The Week' has been a fantastic opportunity to work with our partners and the local communities to hear their concerns and work together to find solutions to help improve the local environment. There have been other events across the two areas including community litter picks, help and advice surgeries and sessions about money, loan sharks and legal advice."

### Triple P Parenting Offer

Early Help's Triple P offer provides supportive action for families at every stage of their lives by providing a range of information and support through workshops and seminars for parents and carers with children and a new programme has just landed that will continue through to December.

Group Triple P is an 8-week programme for any parent or carer with a child aged 0-12 years old. We also offer an 8-week programme for parents and carers with teenagers offering advice and knowledge to improve communication and manage conflict. Our latest offer – Family Transitions Triple P is ideal for parents affected by separation or divorce and worried about the effect upon their children. The course focuses on how to cope positively with stress and provides skills to resolve conflicts with former partners in order to continue to coparent effectively even though separated.

Triple P sessions and workshops will be delivered in schools and local community venues in Bedford from September to December. Anyone unable to follow the full 8-week programme can come along to the Triple P discussion groups held throughout September to December offering advice on topics such as 'Developing Good Bedtime Routines' to 'Getting Teenagers to Cooperate'.

Cllr Henry Vann, Portfolio Holder for Education said: "Supporting families at every stage can make all the difference to the life chances of our children and young people. Our Early Help Team is there to support parents and equip them with the key skills to deal with the challenges they may face in raising children and young people by offering a flexible range of support options."

"Since 2016, over 500 parents and carers have already attended a Triple P sessions, I would urge all parents and carers to get in touch if they need this support."



### Black History Month 2018 at The Higgins Bedford



Celebrate this year's Black History Month at The Higgins Bedford with a fascinating exhibition, African and Caribbean Heritage Day, and crafty activities based on African and Caribbean history and culture over the half-term.

'Paved With Gold': Bedford's Windrush Generation Exhibition opens on 6th October 2018 and runs to 24th March 2019. This exhibition highlights the Windrush Generation's journey to Bedford, and will explore their legacy of endurance and determination through the challenges they faced and the contributions they made to the community. It is completely free to visit.

African and Caribbean Heritage Day returns to The Higgins Bedford on Saturday 27th October, with community stalls and the chance to hear local Windrush stories. There will be music, art and the opportunity to take part in activities and discussions exploring African and Caribbean history and culture. October's half term activities are based on African and Caribbean history and culture with craft workshops.

On Tuesday 23rd October, there will be an Adinkra Art workshop with Nubian Teachings; creating spectacular works of arts based on Adinkra visual symbols. Cost- £2.70 per child.

Wednesday 24th October will see a mosaic tiles workshop with Qemamu Mosaics, joining local artist Dionne Ible in creating a Qemamu Mosaic tile to take home. Cost- £5 per child.

On Friday 26th October the 'Future Self' workshop invites children to join local artist Kemi Onabule in exploring the exhibition, 'Paved with Gold': Bedford's Windrush Generation. Children will be creating mixed media self-portraits inspired by personal hopes and ambitions. Cost- £2.70 per child.

These workshop will all take place at 11am, 12,30pm and 2pm, are aimed at children aged 5-13 and are unsuitable for children aged 3 and under. All children must be accompanied by an adult. Booking in advance is recommended as places will go quickly. To book, please purchase a ticket at The Higgins Bedford reception desk. Bookings cannot be taken over the phone or online. Unfilled places will be offered on a first-come, first served basis on the day.

The Higgins Bedford will also be hosting a HipHop Workshop during half term; on Friday 26th October from 11am to 5pm. VyMy Dance & Fitness will be running this hip hop dance and art workshop, giving kids the chance to learn basic hiphop skills and the history behind the style.
