At Christmas we say 'Happy Christmas.' At Easter we say 'Happy Easter.' But have you ever heard someone greet you with the words 'Happy Lent'?

Lent is a preparatory season where we get ready for the great Christian feast of Easter. Our getting ready is a building of our spiritual preparedness. A journeying together to that wonderful celebration. A pilgrimage if you like.

Why do we do this? We do this because of Christ's Easter resurrection which causes new life to burst from the tomb and into the world.

New life will change things, will change us, if we want to be changed. Unimaginable new life is offered to us through Christ's resurrection but we must be willing to accept it. But often the prospect of being changed through Christ is deeply scary. I wonder if you might reply 'All this talk about new life, I'm perfectly happy with my old life, thank you very much.'

If all Christianity offered was a bit of a spiritual polish where we remained the same but just a bit shinier, a bit holier round the edges, it would be superficially more attractive. It would also, however, be virtually pointless. Church, being part of the family of God, would be a waste of time. Far better to stay home and have a lazy morning reading the papers and eating croissants. Or keeping warm instead of going out to a prayer meeting. Or not being made fun of because of your beliefs. Or not making sacrifices and surrendering all that you have and are to Jesus Christ.

This new life that we are offered is costly and scary, but it is wonderful, transformational, exhilarating new life. This offer is not just of a 'thanks very much and forget about it' nature. It is the offer of a lifetime. It is the offer of new life. And such an offer should not be taken lightly.

So, during Lent, Christians prepare through prayer and self-reflection and self-denial. This isn't meant to be season of misery. It is a season of sacrifice and surrender. Through such preparations, we hope to be able to grasp and accept ever more deeply the new wonderful, joyful life offered in Christ.

Happy Lent.
