Seeking God

'They saw the young Child...and worshipped Him.'

Matthew 2:11

Notice two things about the wise men:

- 1) How God guided them. 'The star which they had seen in the East went before them, till it came and stood over where the young Child was...And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary His mother, and fell down and worshipped Him' (vv. 9-11 NKJV). Never limit God. And don't lock Him into a personal experience you had in the past where He guided you in a certain way. If God can move a star, He can rearrange any circumstance in your favour. How did the wise men know about the birth of Christ? Maybe because of an alignment of the planets, or because they were students of Old Testament prophecy. We don't know. But one thing is certain: they were seeking God—and that's the point at which we must all begin.
- 2) How God protected them. Herod wasn't happy about the news these men brought. Indeed, he was downright enraged. Think: if he was willing to kill every Jewish baby boy under the age of two in order to get at Jesus, what were the chances that these men would get out of town alive? Not great—until God stepped in! 'Then, being divinely warned in a dream that they should not return to Herod, they departed for their own country another way' (v. 12 NKJV). The devil is real, but you don't have to be afraid, because Jesus has already defeated him. The main thing is: when your heart is set on seeking God, He will guide you, protect you and reward you.

This month we met at George's, our leader was Trevor Ogden. This was the first time Trevor has been with us and it was a great pleasure to welcome him. Trevor chose three words, al beginning with the letter 'L' for our studies over three weeks. The first 'L' was **LIGHT**.

In Genesis we read that God created light as the whole world was in darkness. Darkness cannot exist when light comes I, light dispels darkness. God is light & in Him is no darkness at all.

We read that God's word, the bible, can be a lamp to our feet and a light to our path. Psa 119 v105.

We read in John's Gospel Ch. 1 VV 1-9 that Jesus was the light sent by God that all men that believe on Him might have eternal life through His name.

That brings us to the next 'L' which is LIFE. On the Sunday we learned that Trevor had been called to Scotland and would not be with us on the Wednesday, so we arranged to discuss the word 'life' together.

In John's Gospel Ch. 14 v6 Jesus said "I am the way, the truth and the life". The question was asked, What was the 'life' Jesus was speaking of?

Jesus said "I am come that ye might have life to the full, or an abundant life. Life to the full, a Joyful life, a happy life, a life of inward happiness, a life that only the Christian can know.

Although we were down on numbers that evening we had a good discussion and looked forward to Trevor being with us the next week to study the next letter 'L' which was **LOVE**.

It was not difficult to find hymns and choruses to sing concerning love. Our last evening with Trevor began with the hymn "Love Devine all Loves Excelling" we usually sing two or three hymns to start with and an opening prayer before we hand over to the speaker for the evening.

Trevor began by turning to Deuteronomy Ch. 7 vv 7-9 which speaks of God's covenant of Love to His people, also 1 Kings Ch. vv 7-9.

Deuteronomy state that we must keep his commandments(v9), Psalm 36 vv 7 & 8 speaks of a Priceless Love, Isa 34 v 10 speaks of an Unfailing Love, Jeremiah speaks of an Everlasting Love, Romans talks of a Love 'Poured Out', and let's not forget the 'Gospel in a nutshell' John Ch. 3 v 16 –

For God so love the world that he gave His only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in Him shall not perish, but have eternal 'life'.

After the study we always turn to prayer, with so many things to thank God for and so many people in this world who need our prayers and the needs of our world and all its problems. After spending time in prayer we all enjoy a cup of tea and leave around 9:45pm.
