A few months ago we may have had no idea what phrases such as "Social distancing" and "Self isolation" meant, we certainly do now. For the past few weeks this new way of living may have come for some as a welcome relief from the "rat race" of modern life, when life has calmed down, motors and machines were turned off. For a while you could hear the birds and breathe the clean air, but now we are facing the reality that whilst life is beginning to get slowly back to "normal" these restrictions are going to be with us for many more months.

Whilst reading Mark's Gospel I was struck by the number of times that Jesus "self isolated" and how that might be a pattern for us to make the most of this ongoing situation.

Mark 1:12 records *Jesus' isolation* in the desert immediately before he began his earthly ministry. The Spirit drove him into the wilderness where the Devil tested Jesus' resolve to commit his life to the Father's will. Maybe we can use these troubled times to re-connect with God and to ask him "what does he want us to do for him, what talents and abilities can we offer in His in service and the service of others.

Mark 1:35 Jesus gets up early and finds a "solitary place" to pray. I find myself waking up very early these days, strange as I don't have to be anywhere or go anywhere! But it is a wonderful time of quietness, a great opportunity to spend some of that time in prayer. I know I feel challenged to follow Jesus' example.

Mark 6:31 "Come with me" Jesus said to the disciples "to a quiet place and get some rest." Ironically in these times of isolation I sometimes find it hard to rest, I need to find that quiet place in my soul and rest with Jesus. We all need to remember to take care of ourselves in these times, eat well, rest well and take exercise.

Mark 15:34 "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?". Does Jesus understand what we are going through in these times? As he hung on that cross taking our sin upon himself his Father looked away from his beloved son for the first and only time in eternity. Yes Jesus does understand the heartache of isolation.

We will meet again in our church buildings, but as we wait in expectation for that celebration to worship together once again, may Christ draw close to each and every one of us and help us to stay safe, stay well and stay close to Him.
